My.Scouting.Org: The new BSA website is now fully updated with access to everything that used to be at the old myscouting.org, including charter, JTE (Journey to Excellence), service hours, activity plans. Click "Menu" and choose "Legacy Web Tools".

BSA Charter Preparations:

Applications need to be turned in NOW for all new leaders and boys in 2016. Webelos who had a birthday and move up to 11 Year Old Scouts need to fill out a new application as a boy scout immediately.

BSA Training needs to be completed for all leaders. This includes yearly Youth Protection and one-time Leader Specific Training. See your unit commissioner to check the BSA list of trained leaders in your unit.

Charter Forms & Training are at the Oct 13 Round Table, including lists of boys and leaders who are registered, and which leaders are trained.

Youth Protection Training is required yearly for all cub and boy scout leaders in the David Thompson District. This half hour training is available online at my scouting org. This year, a CD and quiz will be available in each unit's charter packet at the Oct 13 Round Table.

Leader specific training will not be offered this fall at Round Table. Plan to attend on Sat, Nov 5 am (date has changed) at Sandpoint Stake Center OR Dec 3 in Spokane at the University of Scouting, OR complete the course online at my.scouting.org within 3 months of being called/application approved and before charter. This one-time training for den leaders, cubmasters, committee chairs, committee members (like parents and Primary Counselor over cubs), does NOT need to be repeated for the same position.

Outdoor Leadership Training is Nov 18-19. This Friday night to Saturday training is for all 11 year old scout leaders as well as other boy scout leaders. It is a one-time training and does not need to be repeated for the same position. Register with LaMar Olsen.

Turn in Charter on Dec 1, 4:00 to 6:00 at the Sandpoint Stake Center. Bobbie Jo, LaMar Olsen and the unit commissioners will be in the Family History Center to answer last-minute questions and help finalize charters.
